



From the Principal

The end of Term 3 has come around way too quickly with so much achieved and so much for us yet to complete before our 50th Anniversary celebrations in 2020. We have lots to celebrate and some things to reflect upon as all families prepare to enjoy a well-deserved break to the normal school routine.

Those families who were able to join us last Friday for the faction athletics carnival would have enjoyed a day of great competition and sportsmanship held in very pleasant conditions in our beautiful grounds. Against all odds, O'Connor came from behind to win the carnival with some extremely impressive displays in the team games which saw them just pip Stirling at the end of the day. We had lots of impressive competitors who scored big points for their factions, but every child who competed contributed to their team's total and tried just as hard as our champions. We will belatedly present a champion's medal to Isabel Roser at tomorrow's informal assembly.

More of the good news. We were informed yesterday that we have received \$26 000 for some minor maintenance projects around the school which we can complete before the end of the year. I will sit down with our Manager Corporate Services, Jenni, to identify some minor projects like replacing carpets. We have also been allocated almost \$200 000 for the upgrade of some of our toilets, external door painting, the repair or replacement of the roof in the undercover area and a couple of other projects. Along with this we are currently seeking quotes to double the size of our stage area to accommodate Edu-dance and our end-of-year performance and to increase the height of our fencing around the early childhood playground.

We receive more detailed information on our NAPLAN performance tomorrow. What we do know is that our Year 3 performance across all five areas was good and that this year's Year 5 students didn't do as well as previous cohorts in Maths and Grammar. As a group, staff have analysed why this particular cohort struggled where others haven't and have put some changes in place as how we will teach these two learning areas. We will also look at exposing our students to more testing on iPads as many Year 5 students Grammar scores were actually lower than they achieved in Year 3 when they completed the test on paper!

In the office we are trying to work out the number and size of classes for 2020 and, if you do know that your child won't be returning to Bateman PS next year, we would appreciate it if you could inform us of this as soon as possible. Staff won't be looking at class allocations until we are pretty confident about class structures and sizes in early December. Every year, one or two parents ask me if we can please just have "straight" classes, despite research showing there is no measurable difference between "straight" and "split". My answer always is that while we could create a few "straight" classes, the majority would be split and split in such a way as to hinder the high levels of collaboration in planning and moderation of student work that currently exist.

Thank You to all parents for being such an amazing and supportive community and making Bateman Primary such a wonderful productive, safe and happy environment for our children. I hope all of you make the most of this break from school routine before we are back to Edu-dance, inter-school athletics, excursions, reports and awesome classroom activities and our end of year activities.

ICT News

Can I remove ZuluDesk from my iPad over the holidays?

While it is possible to remove the ZuluDesk profile from your iPad over the holidays, we strongly recommend against doing so. Over the holidays, as long as the iPad is not attempting to connect to the school Wi-Fi, the ZuluDesk profile should be dormant and not in any way affect or restrict your iPad usage. Removing the profile should therefore provide no benefit, though there is a downside. If you were to remove the profile during the holidays, the iPad would have to be completely wiped in order to set it up with the school network once it intends to be used as a BYOD device again.

Can I Restore My iPad from iTunes over the Holidays?

Please also take note that a BYOD iPad cannot be restored with an iTunes backup without losing all ZuluDesk functionality. This means that the iPad would have to be wiped once again in order to set up ZuluDesk, so defeating the purpose of restoring data to the iPad (from iTunes).

How do I Retrieve Backed Up Data from iCloud?

If any data needs to be backed up and restored to a BYOD iPad, it is recommended to sync the iPad to iCloud before installing ZuluDesk. Then retrieving any data from iCloud once the iPad has been successfully set up with ZuluDesk for BYOD. This data should be restored individually and not using the full iPad restore option that can be done via iCloud because it would cause the same problems as restoring the iPad via iTunes. Please refer to the BYOD Partial iPad Data Restore from iCloud Tutorial for further information.





For the fathers and father figures night, **Friday 27th September** is **whiskey night**. Kick off time will be between 7 and 7:30pm.


