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REMINDERS

HOMEWORK

Reading, Mathletics, completing unfinished schoolwork.

It is also recommended to practice **spelling** regularly. Occasionally, we may send home a project or speech for children to work on at home and present in class. Details will be sent home to you when this occurs.

We encourage students to **read for enjoyment** as much as practicing their reading skills, and this can include any type of text that they enjoy!

Developing **Fact Fluency** is important to developing their mathematical abilities. Just as reading regularly enhances their reading ability, it is a great benefit to practice skills at home where students can add, subtract, multiply and divide efficiently and effectively.



• MATHEMATICS

This term our number focus will be looking at place value, rounding, percentages, decimals, and money. In measurement, we are looking at volume, capacity and mass and using appropriate metric units. In geometry we are using 3D shapes, and practicing transformation of objects.

• ENGLISH

Reading comprehension skills are taught and integrated across the curriculum, identifying the relevant strategy and focusing on this for each text. We will be looking at a novel study, information texts related to HASS and levelled readers.

Talk4Writing will be discussing Explanations and Persuasive Texts. We build a toolkit of strategies that enhance their writing, and can be applied across other texts, and develop an in-depth understanding of the text structure. Students will be practicing their persuasive skills!

• HASS - HISTORY

Year Four will be doing various activities about explorers, the First Fleet and the interactions between people during colonisation.

Year 5 curriculum is focused on colonial life and Australia's development as a nation.

• HEALTH

The first half of the term we will be discussing Protective Behaviours which is a framework for personal safety – it is a confidence building, empowering approach that links safety with having adventures and taking risks. The second half of the term we will be looking at changes in our bodies as we start discussing puberty. There will be more information sent home to parents regarding this content, closer to the time.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGIES

There will be various projects for students to work through the design process, as they create items and/or simple machines to achieve a goal.

VISUAL ARTS

Students will be 'sculpting' this term, using mixed materials to create a totem. This project is linked to HASS and reading. We are collecting the cardboard from PAPER TOWEL ROLLS if you have any to donate, please send them into school week 3.
