

2020 SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES

Dear Parents

The Education Act 1999 requires schools to notify parents of all Contributions and Charges within two months of the following school year. This schedule has been prepared in accordance with the School Education Act 1999 and School Education Regulations 2000 and has been endorsed by the Bateman Primary School Board.

The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow parents to calculate all costs that **MAY** be incurred throughout the school year. It must be pointed out that these costs are calculated on an “**up to a maximum of**” basis and may not necessarily reach this limit. When this maximum total is not reached, funds will be rolled into the following year or refunded upon request if the child is leaving the school.

1. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS:

The total amount of **voluntary contributions** parents and/or guardians are being asked to pay to the school is **\$60.00 per child** as per the School Education Regulations 2000 (ie \$60.00 per child).

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the areas listed below. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of teaching and learning programmes will be maximised when each family makes a contribution to the cost of supplementing the funding gained from other sources, including State and Commonwealth Governments.

The School Board would like to point out the contribution per child (\$60.00) equates to \$1.50 per week over the course of the year and that all contributions are used for the direct benefit of the children.

Selection processes are undertaken to select students to participate in PEAC and Instrumental Music. Upon selection, participation is optional. The cost of Instrumental Music depends on which instrument is hired or purchased. **There are no charges for tuition. PEAC is a supplementary programme and, as such,** participation is optional. The total charges and contributions paid per student will depend on the number and type of PEAC courses chosen by that student.

2.3 Other items available to **all students** but conditional on a payment being made:

Graduation T-Shirt	This is optional for purchase by Year 6 students only and is no more than \$40.00
Graduation USB	Optional for purchase by all students and is usually \$25.00
School Photographs	Kapture Photographers will provide all children the option to purchase photographs ranging from \$20.00 - \$75.00 per child.
Lost Library Books	Students who lose or damage school library books will be charged for the replacement cost. Some books that are lost are extremely valuable and time consuming to replace. Each library book is accessioned and covered in plastic and usually costs more than when originally purchased.
Lost Badges	Students will be asked to pay for the cost to replace their lost or damaged badge. Replacement cost is \$12.00 per badge.
Fundraising	Charitable Collections & School Fundraising Activities may include Free Dress Days, Sausage Sizzles, Cake Stalls & Movie Nights. Costs range from 50 cents to \$15.00 depending on the activity.

3. ITEMS FOR PERSONAL USE IN THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The charge for **personal use items** will vary from student to student. Below is a summary of charges. The Personal Use Items have been distributed separately. The items can be purchased through Ziggies or a supplier of your own choice. Please be aware that consumables might need to be replaced throughout the school year.

4. VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

P & C Contribution

The Bateman Parents & Citizens Association has set a \$30.00 donation per child. This donation reduces the amount of fundraising undertaken by the P & C throughout the year. In 2019 the P & C allocated funds to the grounds beautification project and to purchase student resources, library resources, phys-ed equipment and subsidise student activities throughout the school.

P&C also hosts several fundraisers throughout the year including, discos, spell-a-thon and sausage sizzles.

5. PAYMENT

Please Note: Payment is not required until 2020. The Manager Corporate Services will send a Statement of Account in the first weeks of the 2020 school year outlining the amounts owing less any funds rolled over from the previous year.

Payments can be made to the school office in 2020 by cash, cheque or EFTPOS or our preferred method is by direct debit into the school bank account.

Bateman Primary School run a pre-payment system and most families elect to take advantage of this facility. If you do not wish to utilize this service, payments for individual events such as excursions, Edu-Dance etc must be made by cash on a 'pay as you go' basis. When making payments by cash, the correct money must be enclosed in an envelope with the child's name and the relevant permission/remittance slip. The school operates with minimum cash on our premises; if incorrect amount is enclosed surplus money will be allocated to your child's account. Please note: It is the school policy that if payment is not received prior to the event your child will not take part.
