CURRICULUM

Below are some highlights of what we plan to cover in class this term. Curriculum will be differentiated wherever possible to provide students with the opportunity to receive instruction at an appropriate level for them. If you would like to help your child at home, we suggest using the below information as a guide.

MATHEMATICS

This term in mathematics we will be learning about **location**. Students will use grid referencing and cardinal directions to describe and find the location of objects. Students will also be learning how to measure **capacity** and **volume** of objects, by using informal and formal units to measure and compare. We will be investigating **angles** and using our protractors to measure. We will also review the four operations (**addition**, **subtraction**, **multiplication** and **division**). It would benefit students to regularly practice their **times tables** at home so they can apply their understanding during problem solving activities.

ENGLISH

We plan to build on students' understandings of **less common consonant spellings** during phonics lessons. Students will practice different strategies for sounding out, chunking and spelling unknown words. We will continue to revise different spelling rules.

In reading, we will be focusing on building **vocabulary** and **background knowledge** through a range of novel studies, fiction and non-fiction texts. We will continue working on a range of strategies to help build comprehension. Students will be asked to **answer questions** and **summarise** (recalling the main points and ideas of the texts) what they have read.

Narratives and **discussions** will be the focus for our writing this term. We will be looking at various ways to start and end a story to create interest. We will continue to revise everyday writing skills including **grammar**, **punctuation** and **editing**.

HEALTH

This terms Health focus will be on **healthy habits**. Children will look at the importance of nutrition, exercise and sleep to keep their bodies healthy.

HASS

Throughout Semester Two, we will be looking at **history**. Students will be asked to research early contact between Aboriginal people and other cultures. We will look at the significance of special events and days we celebrate such as remembrance day.

OTHER

Throughout the term, we will also be participating in a number of **art** and **design technology** projects.

HOMEWORK

In Year 3 and 4 the homework expectations include; **daily reading** a book of choice for at least 20 minutes each day. This should be recorded in student diaries. **Mathletics** activities are able to be accessed by students each day through a computer or iPad. Occasionally, your child's teacher may send home a **project** or work that has not been finished in class.
